What is the LECI?


- A multipartner Initiative designed to harness the urban natural assets of the City of Lilongwe for biodiversity conservation, tourism, public recreation, environmental education and awareness for urban sustainability.
- A component of a broader framework for the transformation of the City of Lilongwe to a more livable City – clean, green and prosperous.
- Initiative rests on the integration of a number of the City's key ecological systems.



Lilongwe Nature Sanctuary



400-hectare reserve in the heart of the capital, Lilongwe, which is the city's most prominent natural green space and a critical part of Lilongwe's unique natural history and increasingly fragile biodiversity.
